In many dental offices, dental assistants perform clerical and laboratory duties, as well. They help prepare materials for making impressions and restorations, expose radiographs and process dental X-ray film as directed by the dentist.

## Job Outlook

Choosing a career as a dental assistant is a smart decision, since entry-level dental professionals are currently in high demand. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of dental assistants is projected to grow 18 percent through 2024, much faster than the average for all occupations.<sup>†</sup>

## Employment

Almost all jobs for dental assistants are in the offices of dentists. Dental assistants work in a well-lit, clean environment. About half of dental assistants have a 35- to 40-hour workweek, which may include work on Saturdays or evenings.

## Certification

Most states regulate the duties that dental assistants are allowed to perform through licensure, registration or certification. These are acknowledgments of a dental assistant's qualifications and professional competence and may be an asset when seeking employment.
