- Provide treatments to those with physical disabilities or mental illness to achieve greater independence
- Help people regain their independence after an injury
- Focus on the physical, cognitive, psychological and social influences of occupational performance
- Understand medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, psychology, kinesiology, growth and development as they relate to occupational therapy



WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS TRAINING?

- Provide treatment interventions to infants, children, adults and geriatric patients
- Help and encourage patients to complete therapeutic activities, exercises and other interventions
- Lead children who have congenital/developmental disabilities in play activities that promote skill development and successful participation in ageappropriate occupations that are meaningful to the child and their family
- Manage treatment plans under the supervision of an occupational therapist

PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT

Help patients who are recovering from injuries and illnesses to improve movement and function.





YOU WILL LEARN HOW TO:

- Treat patients through exercise, gait and balance training and other therapeutic interventions as directed within the physical therapist plan of care
- Observe and monitor patients before, during and after therapy, noting the patient's status and reporting it to a physical therapist
- Utilize equipment to help improve patient mobility and function with daily activities



WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS TRAINING?

- Have direct patient care, helping patients recover from and prevent injuries and illnesses
- Manage tasks that are indirectly related to patient care, such as preparing the treatment area and communicating with other healthcare professionals
- Educate patients, caretakers and other healthcare providers

RADIOGRAPHY

Perform diagnostic medical imaging examinations as a healthcare professional.





YOU WILL LEARN HOW TO:

- Properly operate imaging equipment
- Read and interpret requisitions from physicians
- Prepare patients for procedures, take medical histories and answer questions about the procedures
- Position the patient and the equipment to provide a diagnostic image
- Operate and understand computerized equipment
- Evaluate and critique images and determine if additional images are needed



WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS TRAINING?

- Provide diagnostic images for the physician so that a proper diagnosis can be reached
- Conduct examinations and provide radiation safety, radiation protection and basic patient care
- Perform imaging exams such as chest X-rays, fluoroscopic studies, orthopedic procedures and more

RESPIRATORY THERAPY

Specialize in prevention, diagnosis, treatment, management and rehabilitation of patients with breathing or other cardiopulmonary disorders.





YOU WILL LEARN HOW TO:

- Provide treatment that can range from giving emergency relief to patients with respiratory disorders to long-term care for chronic conditions such as COPD or Cystic Fibrosis
- Manage and master life-saving devices such as mechanical ventilators and non-invasive machines
- Develop the clinical skills to manage respiratory disorders in a variety of patient populations from premature babies to geriatrics
- Administer breathing treatments and other adjunct therapies to improve lung function
- Educate patients about their condition and how to properly use medication and equipment



WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS TRAINING?

- Monitor, manage and modify life support equipment, including resuscitating patients
- Interview and assess patients with breathing or cardiopulmonary disorders
- Consult with physicians to diagnose lung diseases and develop patient treatment plans
- Perform diagnostics to measure lung function and assess severity of disease
- Be a valuable and active part of the team in end-of-life and palliative care

SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY

Prepare operating room, equipment and supplies for surgical procedures, advocate for patient safety and manage sterile field throughout the operative procedure.





YOU WILL LEARN HOW TO:

- Understand the properties of lasers and physics in the surgical setting
- Prepare surgical robotics and endoscopic equipment for use during surgery
- Facilitate the safe and effective conduct of both invasive and non-invasive surgical procedures
- Interact with a healthcare team and work under the supervision of a surgeon
- Become the go-to person on the surgical team who manages equipment, instrumentation and supplies during surgical procedures



WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS TRAINING?

- Sterilize equipment, assemble surgical supplies and set up operating room for surgery
- Assist surgical team with patient transport and positioning
- Prepare patients for surgery, such as by washing and disinfecting incision sites
- Help surgeons during surgery by passing instruments and other sterile supplies
- Count supplies, such as sponges and instruments
- Prepare and handle medications used during the operative procedure
- Maintain a sterile environment
