



Interpretive Guide to the PTA Student Financial Fact Sheet

The Commissioner on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) requires all Physical Therapist Assistant Programs to “provide the public with current, accurate, reliable, and easily available information about the cost of attendance” (CAPTE Rules of Practice and Procedures 8.20(c) Student Costs).

The fact sheet, provided by CAPTE, is a summary of the tuition costs for students who graduated between August 2022 to August 2023. The annual tuition costs are based on the published tuition price for the year they started. (e.g., February 2020 start date reflects January 2020 tuition).

- a. The start date and completion date reflect a cohort of students that graduated from the program within the given time frame.
- b. The program does not require students to seek alternative housing or travel accommodations to attend school. However, the students are aware they may travel up to clinical externships that are greater than 60 miles from the school and, depending on the students’ situation, may need to secure housing/transportation. (Student can travel further than 100 miles.)
- c. Student Costs for Year 1 are based on semesters One through Three and include:
 - i. Tuition costs and the \$150 registration fee
 - ii. Required text books and uniforms
 - iii. The PTA program includes general education courses within the curriculum and is not separate from the technical/professional phase
- d. Student Costs for Year 2 are based on semesters Four to Five and include:
 - i. Tuition costs
 - ii. Required text books
- e. Total Costs of the program includes:
 - i. Annual Tuition based on costs per credit hour
 - ii. Registration fee, uniforms, textbooks, and technology fees
 - iii. State specific taxes and fees, as applicable
- f. Financial aid options, scholarships and work study, etc. may be available to those who qualify.
- g. Student debt from the technical phase: Debt prior to entering in the program is not collected due to Student’s Rights and not required by the Department of Education. The average debt is what was incurred when starting the program.
- h. Student debt after program completion: the institution provides a calculated median debt which includes institutional fees, federal loans, and alternative loans owed once they graduate.
