Radiography Associate Degree Program Admissions Guide

Thank you for your interest in the Radiography Program. To be eligible for acceptance into the program, multiple components will be evaluated. This document provides guidelines and helpful hints to support you through the process.

Traditional Program Admissions Process

(Albuquerque, El Paso, San Antonio)

Any program with fewer than 80 qualified candidates per cohort start.

The PD sets a number of interview slots based on their cohort size (at least twice the number of students in the budget).

The admissions team schedules the interviews with the program director and the qualified candidates. (Additional interviews will be scheduled as needed to fill the cohort.)

Accepted candidates may be placed on the waitlist if the program has no available seats. Once a cohort starts, "Accepted Waitlisted" students who do not start are notified that they must reapply for the next cohort.

Large Candidate Program Admissions Process

(Chula Vista, Denver, Houston, Las Vegas, Mesa, Seattle, and Tucson)

Any program with 80+ qualified candidates per cohort start.

Only those candidates whose files are *complete* and contain *current* information will be eligible for an interview. It is recommended that all candidates review the [PMI Catalog](#) regarding Admissions requirements.

The program will have a 2-3-month application window. *Applications will not be accepted outside of this time frame.

Once the acceptance window closes, all applicants with the proper documentation on file are ranked by entrance exam test scores, and interviews will be scheduled and conducted for the next start date.

Accepted candidates may be placed on the waitlist if the program has no available seats. Once a cohort starts, "Accepted Waitlisted" students who do not start are notified that they must reapply for the next cohort.

Based on the number of applicants, some will be left to decide whether to reapply for the next cohort or explore other options.



Admissions Requirements

Prospective students must satisfy the admissions requirements outlined in the catalog (e.g., proof of high school graduation or equivalent) and meet the program’s entrance exam requirements (see below). For general admission requirements, refer to the academic catalog.

- A minimum score of 20 on the Wonderlic® exam*
- A minimum score of 24 points on the math test*

**Note: An average is calculated for multiple attempts in a 12-month period for cut score calculations*

Once the candidate has met the initial requirements, the candidate will be notified of the next steps. The following items are not required but will be awarded points during the interview. These documents should be submitted prior to the interview.

- Calendar for Success (Appendix A)
- College transcripts OR proof of post-secondary degree completion OR relevant military training

Following the interview, the program director will combine the Wonderlic, Math, and Interview scores to determine eligibility.

Pre-Determination Category	Maximum Points Possible
Wonderlic Exam	50 points
Math Test	30 points
Program Interview	50 points

Based on the candidate’s total score, one of the following statuses will be identified:

- **Accepted:** meets the cut score (90+ points on interview, Wonderlic and Math combined)
- **Accepted-Waitlist:** meets the cut score, but there are no seats available in the next program start date
- **Unconfirmed:** did not meet the initial cut score, but will be invited back to perform an additional learning activity to determine eligibility (75-89 points on interview, Wonderlic and Math combined)
- **Denied:** did not meet the cut score OR qualify for the additional learning activity (<75 points on interview, Wonderlic and Math combined)
