The "Fair Use" rules provide guidelines that protect from copyright infringement when a work is being used in a limited way, for educational purposes. It can often be considered legal to use images in an academic setting (i.e., on course materials or within a learning management system), especially when the "one-time/one-semester" use of an image is followed.
